

WHAT IS STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM?


When it rains, stormwater can wash harmful things like oil, chemicals, and trash into our lakes and water supply. To protect our water, communities like ours must follow rules set by the Clean Water Act. These rules require us to manage stormwater through a program called the **Stormwater Management Program (SWMP)**.

Here at **Seis Lagos Utility District**, we're working hard to follow these guidelines and keep our drinking water safe. But we can't do it alone – we need your help!

Let's work together to protect our water for everyone.

HERE'S HOW YOU CAN HELP!

Avoid use of fertilizer and pesticides. Use natural alternatives in your garden and home.



Never pour anything into storm drains. Keep your yard clean to prevent debris from blocking runoff ditches and pipes.



Pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly in a trash receptacle.



Properly dispose of household chemicals, paint, and oil.



Report any suspicious disposal or dumping into storm drains that isn't pure storm water.

- Examples include:
- Sewage or wastewater
 - Paint, oil, or grease
 - Soapy water from car washing
